

## **Impact of Pupil Premium Grant in 2013 – 2014**

Pupil Premium children in Year 6 made an average of 3.8 APS in reading, writing and maths over the academic year. This is 0.8 above the expected progress. Their progress average from Key stage 1 was 14.3 APS. This is 2.3 APS above expected. The children had daily intervention sessions in Literacy and maths lessons from February to June.

Key Stage 1 children took part in weekly language development sessions. Their teachers reported an increase in their confidence in taking part in group and class discussions and noticed an improvement in their range of vocabulary.

Pupils in Year 2 made an average of 5.5 APS progress in reading, writing and maths. This is 1.5 APS above expected.

IPads that were purchased offered more opportunities to extend the learning of our more able pupils. An after school session lasting half a term was used to encourage our more able writers. This year 17% of Year 6 attained a Level 5.

Key Stage 2 SAT results show an increase in pupils achieving Level 5 in reading and maths.

Parents who attended workshops over the course of the year said they felt more able to support their children with their reading and maths homework. Attendance figures improved for the children whose parents attended a six week programme on the importance of education, good attendance and timekeeping.
