

## **Sports Premium**

For the academic year 2025-26, it is estimated that Caldmore Primary Academy will be allocated £19,480\*. The money is ring fenced so that it can only be spent on school sport. This is how we intend to spend our allocation:

<sup>\*</sup>This amount is based on a lump sum allocation of £16,000 plus an additional £10 per child aged between 5 and 11 (348 children based on the predicted October 2025 census data).

<sup>\*\*</sup>In reality this spend will be higher as this figure does not include routine maintenance and repair of P.E. equipment.
